We are currently putting several strategies in place, including more one-to-one support, mentor programs and tailored interventions, however these will be much more effective by working together. Please monitor your child's attendance, encourage a positive attitude and above all else, talk to your child. If there is an issue that may be affecting your child's day to day behaviour please reach out and we will do all we can to support them.

ner was Ruby. Well done, all!


