How international trade affects their survival


The importance of upcoming policy decisions

We've launched the academic year with two inspiring STEM talks that set the tone for curiosity, resilience, and critical thinking.



Our first session on the 8th

of September was led by award-winning STEM Ambassador and engineer **Samuela Osei**, who delivered a powerful talk titled "Building Resilience and Healthy Living in Exam Years and Beyond." Pupils gained practical strategies to support their wellbeing and maintain a balanced approach to their studies throughout the year.

We then welcomed **Dr Jeff Ralph** from the University of Southampton, who presented "Statistics – Through the Lens of Teenagers in Society." Dr Ralph offered a fascinating exploration of data trends—from baby names and workforce shifts to university admissions over the past 200 years—equipping pupils with fresh insights and analytical tools to better understand the world around them and why statistics matter.
