


### Food - Full Board

Weight limit of 20kg for suitcase/holdall (your child must manage their own case)

Small rucksack for travelling/ski days

We advise everyone to mark all belongings, especially their bags/suitcase with their name and the name of the school.

Skis, boots, poles, helmets and towels are all provided.

### Handy Tips

- You might also want to pack some mini snacks in your suitcase as skiing uses a lot of calories and local shops don't always have your favourites.
- If possible take a large soft holdall rather than a hard suitcase as this packs easier and is also much better for storage in your room (Small/medium sized holdall)
- Pack a small bag to take on the slopes each day. Preferably without any hanging straps as these can get caught on anything and everything.

### **Valuables**

- Maximum £100 spending money.
- For soft drinks, snacks, souvenirs and extra activities (such as tubing).
- Money or valuables you bring <u>YOU</u> will be responsible for. If you want to take these you need a separate insurance.
- Staff will run a bank service if you want to make use of it.





### **Mobile Phones**



- We recommend students bring their mobiles to contact parents.
- We will be looking after phones over night to ensure students get a good nights rest.
- It is your decision whether or not to take your phone skiing.
- We recommend your son or daughter has adequate mobile phone insurance.
- Please be aware of the high cost of data roaming when abroad (£7 per megabyte, EuroTraveller).
- Need to bring charger and European adapter.



### **Sun Safety**



- The use of sunscreen is compulsory.
- You must never ski without eye protection.
- In the mountains the sun's rays are also reflected off the snow.
- Full UV protection is essential to prevent sunburn and sore eyes.
- Ensure you drink regularly to stay hydrated.

### Cold injuries

- Frostbite
- Hypothermia
- Suitable clothing to provide protection from snow, wind and cold (e.g. ski suit or ski jacket, ski trousers or salopettes, gloves or mittens, goggles, hat, sun cream)
- Pupils clothing monitored by staff
- Judgements made in conjunction with ski school re skiing in bad weather

### COVID-19

- UK is on the French amber list
- Andorra is on the French green list
- Children aged 12 years old or over who are not fully vaccinated and travelling with a fully vaccinated adult are required to present a negative test result (PCR or antigen). However, they do not need to provide an essential reason for travel, nor do they need to selfisolate on arrival.

# COVID-19 (The UK to Andorra)

#### **Vaccinated**

- Sworn statement of honour
- Proof of vaccination status for those 12 years old or over

#### Unvaccinated

- 1. Sworn statement of honour
- 2. Negative COVID tests (no more than 24 hours before travel)
- 3. Must transit through France in under 24hrs
- Passengers arriving from UK are not required to provide any health certification upon arrival in Andorra.
- All travellers are advised by the Andorran authorities to take preventive measures (including social distancing, hand sanitation and wearing masks) and to minimise social interactions.
- Under 12s are exempt from testing and sworn statement of honour

### COVID-19 (Andorra to France)

#### **Vaccinated**

 Proof of vaccination status for those 12 years old or over

#### **Unvaccinated**

- 1. Sworn statement of honour
- Negative COVID test (within 72 hours of departure)

# COVID-19 (France to the UK)

- 1. All children under 18 years, coming to England, will be treated as fully vaccinated at the border.
- This means that children aged 17 and under will be exempt from quarantine and be exempt from day 8 testing.
- 3. Children aged 5 to 17 years will need to take a test on or before day 2 after arrival (arrival day is day 0) (parents responsibility).

\*Due to come into force on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> November

### COVID-19

We depart on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> February, 7 days after breaking up for half term

Please encourage your child to be sensible over these 7 days

Take preventative measures – social distancing, hand washing/sanitation, wearing a mask, limiting social interactions
