### How much sleep should my child be getting?

Below are approximate guidelines that are suitable for most children to feel rested:

Age & Sleep Requirement:

0-3 months - 14-17 hours

4-11 months - 12-15 hours

1-2 years - 11-14 hours

3-5 years - 10-13 hours

6-13 years - 9-11 hours

14-17 years - 8-10 hours

18-25 years - 7-9 hours

Witchford Scout Group was first registered over 45 years ago and currently provides over 40 children with challenging and adventurous experiences in a fun and safe environment.

Unfortunately, since COVID the group has been running with the minimum number of volunteers possible, with several volunteers carrying out multiple roles. This has come about largely due to a lack of engagement from the community. This has the effect that when a volunteer decides to leave, we need to contemplate closing the Group.

At the end of the year, the group will be saying goodbye to one of our assistant leaders and our treasurer, both of which have continued volunteering for years beyond their own children's involvement in scouting. To prevent closure, we must recruit and train an assistant leader for Scouts and a treasurer by December.

To function efficiently and more securely we also need to recruit and train a secretary and an additional assistant leader for Cubs and Beavers.

If you or anyone that you know can fill these roles, or if you have any questions, then please contact me ASAP. All expenses for training and uniform are covered and you will be supported in the role by me and the rest of the team.
