SCIENCE

We will learn about the importance of hygiene and how poor hygiene affected the health of the Victorians. We will learn about nutrition and link this to lessons on plants and seeds. We will plant some seeds to grow.

COMPUTING

We will explore Purple Mash and learn about how to keep safe online, starting with the importance of strong passwords.

ENGLISH

We will be asking questions about Queen Victoria in order to find out about her to write a character description. We will be applying our knowledge about the Victorian era to complete a narrative. We will write instructions on how to do the washing in Victorian times. We will be writing an information text about the Victorian seaside.

HISTORY

<u>MATHS</u>
