



Explore Cambridgeshire's green spaces this autumn:

There are many free to access green spaces across Cambridgeshire, providing opportunities to get out on foot and connect with nature. The <u>Cambs Open Space website</u> shares the top 200 parks in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough to explore, as well as an interactive map of parks across the county and upcoming events in green spaces.

The county council also own eight <u>Local Nature Reserves in Cambridgeshire</u>, all of which are open to the public. They are excellent places to study and learn about wildlife or simply enjoy the health and wellbeing benefits of being in nature

Stay connected with mobile libraries:

Our three mobile libraries make over 400 stops each month, bringing up to 3,000 items of stock to communities across the county, helping more people to use Cambridgeshire Libraries' services.

Mobile libraries can be a lifeline for people who can't get to a static library and enable potentially isolated people and those in rural areas to stay connected and independent by borrowing books, audio books, magazines and jigsaws.

Cambridgeshire's mobile libraries also carry postage stamps and reading glasses, and free walking stick ferrules and hearing aid batteries.

We would like to invite Year 5 parents and carers to join us for school dinner on Thursday 16th October. The meal will be our extremely popular (and very delicious) roast dinner.
















Uniform orders:
