<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The /aɪ/ sound spelt -y at the end of words
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Adding -es to nouns and verbs ending in -y
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Adding -ing -ed to words of one syllable ending in a single consonant letter after a single vowel letter, words ending in e with a consonant before it and word ending in y with a consonant before it
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Adding -er, -est, -y to words of one syllable ending in a single consonant letter after a single vowel letter, words ending in e with a consonant before it and words ending in y
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The /i:/ sound spelt -ey The /ʌ/ sound spelt o
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Contractions
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The suffixes -ly, -ful, -ment, -ness, -less
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Words ending in -tion
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The sound /l/ or /əl/ sound spelt -el, -le, -al, -il and -ll at the end of words
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The /ɔ:/ sound spelt ar after w• The /ɜ:/ sound spelt or after w• The /ɒ/ sound spelt a after w and qu
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Possessive apostrophe (singular nouns)
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The /z/ sound spelt s
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The /s/ sound spelt c before e, i and y
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The /dʒ/ sound spelt as -ge and -dge at the end of words and sometimes spelt as g elsewhere in words before -e, -i, -y
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The /n/ sound spelt kn and (less often) gn at the beginning of words
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The /r/ sound spelt wr at the beginning of words
