Dear Parents and Carers,

Parent Consultation:

Many thanks to our parents for completing the recent consultation in preparation for September. We have shared some of the key results with you below:

Children to wear PE kits on PE days instead of changing into their PE kits in school.




We have decided that PE kits in school on PE and Games days is the best option and we will write to you before the start of term to let you know which days your child has PE and Games.

Adults to wear a face mask while on the school site. (Please note, this cannot be enforced, but we would like to understand how parents feel about it.)



Mask wearing will be optional on the school site from September but we ask all parents to be polite and respectful to those who choose to wear them in an effort to protect the clinically vulnerable members of our community.

Staggered drop/off pick up times



As you will all be aware, there is only one narrow access to our school premises and with close to 300 pupils, the school gate can become very busy and crowded when all parents arrive and leave at exactly the same time. The consultation has shown that just under ¾ of parents would like staggered drop off/pick up times next term. Therefore, in September, there will be two registration times and children have a 15 minute allocated slot to arrive at school before registration closes.

Timings are:

First drop off

Children with surnames starting between A and L:

Arrive between 8.30am and 8.45am, ready for 8.45am registration. School finishes at 3pm.

Second drop off

Children with surnames starting between M and Z:

Arrive between 8.45am and 9am, ready for 9am registration. School finishes at 3.15pm.

Children brought or collected by childminders should use the 8.45am – 3.15pm slot everyday.

Finally I would like again to thank our children. They have adapted so well to the challenges this year has provided, and we should all be proud of their achievements. In our Collective Worship session today, we enjoyed a celebratory dance together and it was a real moment of joy.

We will write to you again the week before the children return for the new academic year. I would like to wish you and your families a wonderful summer break and look forward to welcoming you all back to school on 6th September 2021.
