

Primary PE & Sport Premium Funding 2018/2019

Rackham Primary School, Witchford.

Number of children in Years 1 – 6 who are **eligible** for Sport Premium on the January 2017 School Census = 271

Funding received: £16000 plus £10 per pupils aged 5-11 years old = **Total £18710**

Background:

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make an impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools. In September 2017, the funding offered to schools increased due to the Government's 'Sugar Tax' scheme – how long this will continue to be offered is uncertain.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

During the academic year September 2017 to July 2018 we plan to spend our funding in the following areas:

The pink area of the table details our subscription to the Witchford School Sports Partnership (£1320 – taken from last year's funding)
