Funding received: £16000 plus £10 per pupils aged 5-11 years old = Total £18600 Carry forward from 18/19 = £5487.88 **Total budget for 2019/2020 £24087.88**

Background:

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. It is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make an impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

As of July 2020, there is no further information from the Government about spending beyond the 2019/2020 school year therefore spending had to be planned for assuming it will not be available beyond the end of the Summer term 2020.
