Students engaged in talks and discussions about substance misuse, knife crime, county lines, mental health and offending! The students showed real maturity throughout.










We are very fortunate here at Ramsden that we get to celebrate students' hard work, dedication and success with reward trips. At the end of each half term we have the 4R's trips.


