Exploring the Stone Age- Making Stone Age bread. We crushed wheat and Barley seeds to make flour in a Pestle and Mortar. It was very hard work!



For our science topic, on living things, we have been looking at organ systems.

This week we have been studying the respiratory system and have made working models of the lungs.

As part of Black History Month we have been finding out about Mary Seacole. She helped soldiers in the Crimean war by building a hospital with her own money and treating the soldiers on the battlefield with her herbal remedies.

We had a go at making the herbal remedies. She used crushed Ginger to treat diarrhoea, Lemongrass, which was boiled to make a drink to treat a fever, Okra, which was chopped and used to treat boils, and Aloe Vera to help treat cuts and wounds.





In English, we've been very busy reading "The *Night Beast*". The book is about a large dangerous cat on the loose in the countryside. The students have been writing Newspaper reports on the beast!





The 9/10s have been reading "Saint Death", a book about a Mexican Cartel and how these gangs affect the everyday lives of everyone, even those not associated with them. The students have been writing letters and diaries, using the book as inspiration.
