School Uniform

All students are expected to wear The Ramsden Hall School uniform which consists of the following:

- A sweatshirt with the school logo
- A polo shirt with the school logo
- A jacket with the school logo
- Black trousers

All items (except the trousers) can be purchased from the school office.

It is advised that uniforms are labelled in order that clothing can be identified in the event of loss.

Students who bring bags, jumpers or coats that are not part of school uniform will be asked to store them in their tutor rooms or staff areas until the end of the day.

The school will of course be considerate and sensitive where there is good reason for a pupil attending school without uniform through no fault of his own. The school will provide spare, clean uniform in these cases.

However, students who refuse to wear the correct uniform may have certain privileges removed. Parents and Carers may also be asked to bring the correct uniform into school. In repeated cases parents and carers will be invited in to school to meet with a member of SLT and discuss a support plan.

Boarders will have access to a daily laundry service to ensure that uniforms and other clothes can be kept in a clean condition.

The PE kit is provided by the school without charge.

Jewellery

For reasons of Health and Safety the school requires that students adhere to the following policy:

- Students must not wear rings as these may cause injury
- Any pupil wearing a neck chain should keep this concealed under their school uniform and remove this when taking part in sporting activities
- No form of body or facial piercing is acceptable, including tongue piercing or Flesh Tunnels
- Small stud earrings are acceptable but the school reserves the right to ask students to remove these or cover them up during PE or other sporting activities

Hair

The school encourages students to be expressive and have a sense of personal style. It is important however that students do not seek to draw negative attention to themselves by dressing or styling their hair in a way that may cause offence. Parents and carers are therefore asked to consult with the school if they are in any doubt as to the appropriateness of a new style. For reasons of Health and Safety students will be required to tie back long hair in lessons such as DT and Food Technology.
