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Re: End of Term and January Arrangements

As we approach the end of our first term, I would like to confirm the end of term arrangements. In addition to the updates about the final week this letter also contains vital information about the return in January with instructions about the testing for Covid-19 before returning and the Inset days.

Friday 17th December – Last Day of Term Arrangements

The final day of term will be on Friday 17th December and all students will finish school at 12:25pm. This day will also be our Christmas Jumper Day and the final day of our Food Bank collection, full details of these events are contained in this letter.

Christmas Jumper Day and Foodbank Collection

On the final day of this term, Friday 17th December, we will be holding a Christmas Jumper Day in order to collect donations for the Trussell Trust Food Bank in Dukinfield. Donations will be collected in form rooms across the week starting from Monday 13th December. Donations can be any non-perishable food items or small toiletry items. The items that are most in need for the food bank and items we are looking to collect through the donations are:

Cereal • Soup • Pasta • Rice • Tinned tomatoes/ pasta sauce • Lentils, beans and pulses • Tinned meat • Tinned vegetables • Tea/coffee • Tinned fruit • Biscuits • UHT milk • Fruit juice

Toiletries – Deodorant • Toilet paper • Shower gel • Shaving gel • Shampoo • Soap Toothbrushes • Toothpaste • **Hand wipes**

Any items that can be donated will be gratefully received and will massively help support the local food bank which is relied on significantly, especially at this time of year. Items can be given to form tutors throughout the week and all food items will be collected by the Food Bank on Friday afternoon.

Christmas Jumpers and Non-Uniform

Please be aware that this event is a non-uniform and Christmas jumper event, but not a fancy-dress day. Whilst we encourage students to get into the festive spirit with their Christmas jumpers, we respectfully request that students dress appropriately and avoid costumes, tinsel or short/ripped clothing which would be impractical for learning.

Further to this, normal rules around make-up, jewellery and mobile phones continue to apply, and as per our usual policy, coats and hats are encouraged when outside in cold weather conditions but should be removed when entering the school building.

January Return Covid Testing and INSET Days

As you may already be aware, the government has announced that upon return to school in January 2022, students should complete one on-site COVID-19 test. The purpose of this testing programme is to reduce the prevalence of COVID-19 within our school community and keep everyone safe. We strongly encourage all students to take part in our testing programme with their parent / carer's consent.

Students whose parents / carers do not wish for their child to take part in the testing programme should return to school with the rest of their year group in line with the timetable below. To book a test on the dates listed by year groups below, please use the links next to the relevant year groups date. Consent can be given through the booking system. Please ensure you book a time for a test through his booking system to ensure that we have a





record of who has given consent for testing and to enable the testing staff to manage the testing process efficiently and safely.

In order to carry out the tests before students return, we will be staggering the return to school with students testing on the day prior to them returning to school. The testing and return dates are as follows:
