Curriculum intent

Knowledge of history is key to understanding the world around us and our place within it. Historical skills provide people with the ability to interpret and challenge the information around us.

Learners will be building on both the key skills and the knowledge they acquired last year. They will be examining the continuing development of the role of the monarchy and its conflict with parliament. They will chart the developing role and power of parliament and examine how Britain interacted with the wider world both in the development of the British Empire and World War One.
