Curriculum intent	Learners will continue to enjoy practical experimentation with materials and media to embed skills. The aim of the curriculum is that through the delivery of rubrics, learners will know what the formal elements of art are and how they can be used in drawing, painting and other Fine Art disciplines. All learners will build upon technical skills acquired from previous years and know the importance of 'presentation', 'framing' and 'display'. Links to local galleries, museums and the wider world will encourage learners to recognise that art can represent an object, be abstract or non-objective. Speaking and written skills will show critical thinking and creativity. Learners will continue to refer back to the formal elements of art and enjoy both collaborative and independent learning. On a termly rotation the intention is to give all learners the opportunity to deepen knowledge of each area of ADT.
