


Red Marsh School Performing Arts Week



We hope you enjoyed watching our Red Marsh 'Show Time' from the comfort of your own home.








During Performing Arts Week, pupils had many opportunities to enhance their artistic skills. Pupils developed many skills including: mark making, printing and craft skills.
