Learning at RLA!




Reception

This week, the children have been exploring the concepts of capacity and number in Maths. They particularly enjoyed investigating which containers could hold the most liquid through hands-on experiments. In Topic, the focus has been on the seasonal changes that occur during Autumn, with the children observing and discussing how the environment transforms. Inspired by this, they created beautiful Autumn trees in Art, using a range of warm, autumnal colours to reflect the season.

Year 1

This week in Science, our curious Year One learners have been exploring forces! We introduced them to magnets and they had great fun investigating how they work. Using the key words "attract" and "repel", the children observed how some materials are pulled toward a magnet, while others are pushed away.

Ask your child what objects in your home they think a magnet might attract!





Year 2


From leaves and twigs to stones and petals, the children explored how nature can be used as a canvas — and the results were amazing!

Well done, Year 2 – true natural artists! <u>≫</u>


Year 3

Year 3 mathematicians have been working hard this week making 3-digit numbers and then finding 1,10 and 100 more or less. They started with concrete resources and are now drawing pictorial representations in their books.

Our scientists have studied soil this week and have used magnifying glasses to discover what soil is actually formed from. Ask us to explain using the vocabulary broken and decomposed. We were shocked to discover what is actually helping us to grow our food.

Year 4

Our year 4 scientists have been very busy investigating which materials are insulators and conductors. They discovered that when they put certain metals into a circuit, the bulb lights up! We have really enjoyed learning about electricity this half term. In maths, year 4 have progressed really well and are now doing decimal numbers with tenths and hundredths! Ask your child about what an integer and a decimal number is!

Year 5

Year 5 have loved exploring their poem for National Poetry Day last week. Our theme was play and the children loved 'playing' with words. They felt so inspired by the poetry that they wrote their own! The children performed their poems in assembly for the rest of school. We were so impressed with their expression and pace when they delivered their lines - they had us in stitches! Here are some of our favourite bits:

Flynn - "Is a dinosaur, a T-rex with a chainsaw?!"

Malika - "Does someone actually hope you break your leg when they wish you good luck for
a show?"

Daisy - "Is a timetable, a table that can tell the time?"

Our Year 6 scientists have been investigating how to keep our hearts strong and healthy! As part of their science learning, they explored the importance of a balanced diet, regular exercise, and plenty of sleep in maintaining a healthy heart.

To share what they discovered, pupils created TikTok-style presentations to showcase their findings in a fun and engaging way for the class. They also performed a beautiful poem about the heart, which they proudly shared with parents during our Wednesday "Reading Together" session.
