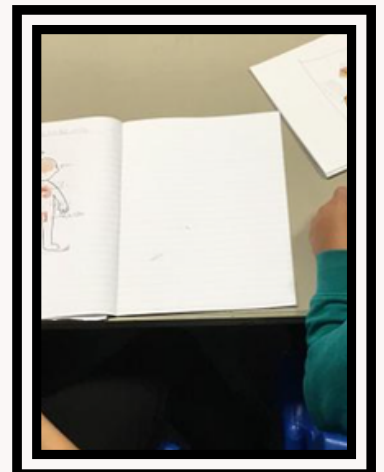

Year 3 Mathematicians have been working very hard this week. We have been learning how we can compare and order numbers to 1000.

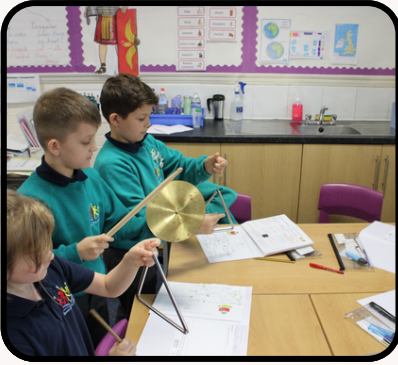

Year 4

In Year 4, we have started to topic of 'sound' in science. We are learning how sound is created, how it travels and how we hear. This week, we used various instruments to explore how vibrations create sound. A very noisy lesson but a great way to start our new topic.



Year 5

Year 5 are excited for their new topic in PE this half term; we are working on using collaboration to improve skills needed for team sports. We have moved on to exploring negative numbers in maths and have been having a go at answering lots of tricky questions based around temperature. Our first science lesson of the half term involved investigating the effects of gravity on objects of various weights, but we soon realised that regardless of the weight, whatever goes up must come down!



Year 6

This week, Year 6 took their history learning to the stage with a series of fantastic performances showing the different perspectives of the Gunpowder Plot. From Guy Fawkes' determination to the Catholics' secret hopes, from King James' fear and anger to the Houses of Parliament's narrow escape, and even the guards' dramatic arrest, every viewpoint was brought vividly to life! The children threw themselves into their roles — plotting, sneaking, and declaring lines with real passion. Mr Chadwick, Miss Plant and Mrs Russell were in the audience and said they thoroughly enjoyed the performances, praising the classes for their confidence, teamwork and historical understanding.
