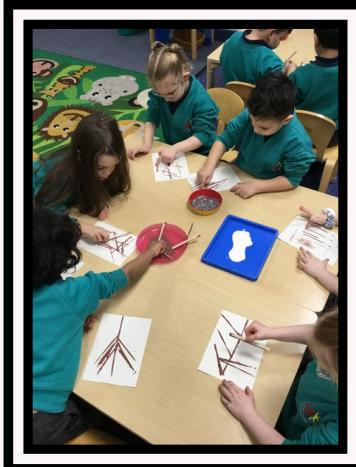

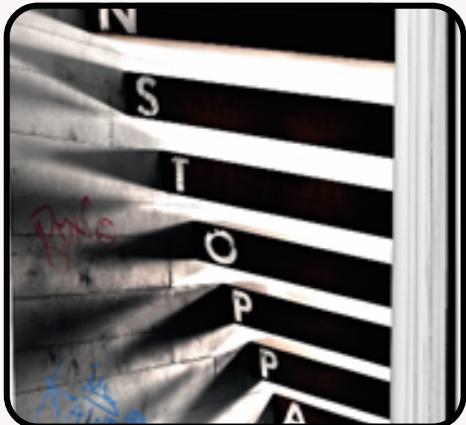
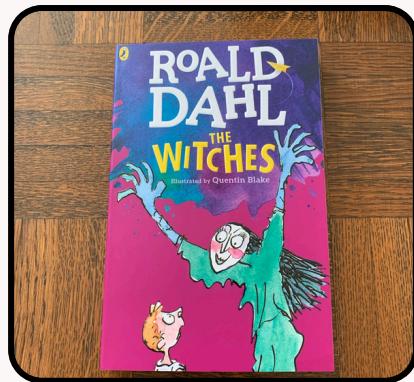


Year 4

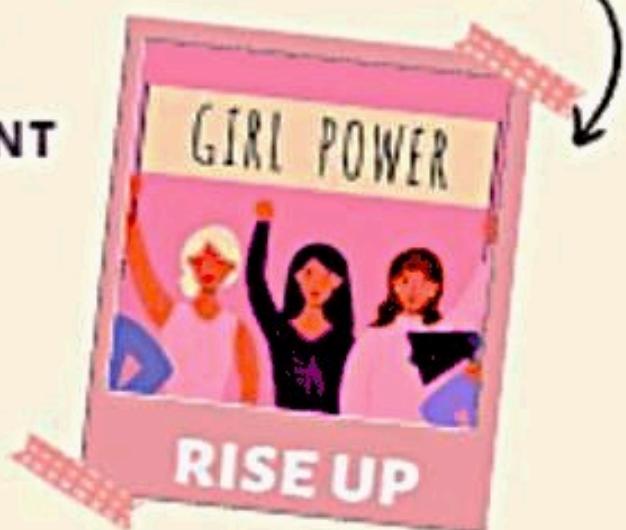

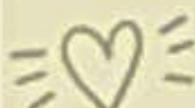
