Reception

Year 1

Our Year 1 learners have been busy little botanists this week!

We explored the different parts of a plant, learning about roots, stems, leaves and flowers. We also discussed how each part helps a plant grow and thrive.

The children loved getting hands-on and discovering how everything works together.

To bring our learning to life, we planted our very own sunflower seeds! The children are so excited to care for them and observe how they grow over time.

We can't wait to see whose sunflower will reach for the sky!

Year 2

This term, our Year 2 children have been exploring expressive painting in art. They began by using primary colours to create bold painted backgrounds, then experimented with a technique called sgraffito, which involves gently scratching into wet paint to reveal interesting textures and patterns. The children then added further marks using other primary colours to build up layers of expression and creativity. We are really proud of the unique and vibrant art pieces they have produced.



Year 3

Year 3 have been super mathematicians this week. We have been learning our 4 times tables and securing our understanding of grouping and sharing.

Our scientists have uncovered the mystery of identifying the real skull which was left in our classroom. They have researched the types of teeth carnivores, herbivores and omnivores have and deduced that the skull belonged to a herbivore. Ask us which animal it belonged to!

Year 4

During our visit, we enjoyed a range of activities including digging, pulling up weeds, painting nature, and hunting for minibeasts. It was fantastic to see their enthusiasm, curiosity, and teamwork shine through as they explored the environment.

This experience links perfectly with our upcoming science topic next half term 'Plants and Animals'. We are looking forward to spending more time in the gardens, where the children will take part in hands-on investigations and develop their understanding of the natural world!

Year 5

On Monday, the children were treated to an actor's workshop from MM Productions. Within the workshop, the children were given backstage passes to 'The Jungle Book', they explored how sets are made, how to work sound and lighting and how actors create characters using their voice. The children loved being involved in the workshop. They took part in activities to give them an insight in what it takes to be an actor! The children worked really hard and we were super proud of them.



Year 6

Year 6 have enjoyed an exciting and enriching week, with two educational visits taking place. 6AC visited Showtown Museum, where they stepped back in time to experience life as evacuees during World War Two. The children took part in a range of engaging, hands-on activities, including using electrical circuits to send and receive Morse code messages and participating in military-style drills.
