Learning at RLA!



Reception

This week, Reception have been very busy settling back into school life after the holidays. We enjoyed an exciting trip to the zoo, where the children were fascinated by all of the different animals. They loved seeing a wide range of them up close, from giraffes to monkeys, and the children were especially excited to spot a baby orangutan. Everybody represented Revoo beautifully, demonstrating excellent behaviour, listening carefully, and showing kindness and respect—we are incredibly proud of them!

In Art, the children explored their creativity by making potato sculptures using a variety of materials, experimenting with different shapes, textures, and designs.

Year 1

This week in Science, the year 1 children have been learning all about Animals and Their Habitats! Building on their previous learning about what a habitat is and what it provides for living things, the children explored different habitats and discussed which animals would be best suited to live in each one. They worked hard to classify animals into the correct habitats, using their growing knowledge and excellent reasoning skills. In addition to this, the children wrote their very own 'Who Am I?' clues so that their friends could guess which animal they were thinking of. The children enjoyed taking their learning beyond the classroom, participating in a range of fun, hands-on activities both outdoors and in the corridor. The children enjoyed creating their very own ocean habitat, where they could think carefully about the animals that live there and the conditions they need to survive.



Year 2

This week in Science, our Year 2 children have been learning all about plants and flowers. They have been busy exploring and labelling the key parts, including roots, stems, leaves and petals.

We enjoyed a lovely afternoon where the children carefully observed some beautiful lilies. They took great care drawing and labelling what they could see, showing fantastic attention to detail and growing confidence in their scientific vocabulary.

Year 3 have settled back in beautifully after half term and are already on their journey towards Year 4. Our favourite part of the week has been starting our exciting new art topic. Using plasticine, the children have been creating bright, colourful 3D models inspired by The Land of Dreams, based on our class novel The Magic Faraway Tree from last term. The children had an amazing time exploring a range of instruments, including drums, guitars, violins and trumpets.

They loved having the chance to become real musicians, creating their own music and working together to produce some impressive sounds. It was wonderful to see their enthusiasm, confidence, and creativity shine as they enjoyed every moment of this unique experience.



Year 6

6SH recently enjoyed an exciting and interactive educational visit to Hangar 42, where they stepped back in time to learn about life during the Second World War. Throughout the day, pupils took part in a range of engaging activities linked to our History curriculum. They explored the events of the Battle of Britain and learned about the bravery of the pilots who defended Britain in the skies. The children also discovered the impact of The Blitz on towns and cities, gaining a deeper understanding of how families coped during wartime.

Another highlight was learning about evacuees and the experiences of children who were sent away from their homes to stay safe. Through artefacts, stories and interactive displays, the pupils developed a real appreciation of what life was like for young people during the war.

The class also became codebreakers for the day, investigating wartime coding and ciphers. They enjoyed solving secret messages and learning how coded communications played a vital role during the war effort. One of the most memorable parts of the visit was the opportunity to get up close to a remarkable collection of Second World War aircraft. Pupils were thrilled to see inside Spitfires and other historic planes, bringing their classroom learning to life in an unforgettable way.

The visit provided a valuable opportunity to deepen pupils' understanding of key aspects of our History curriculum while inspiring curiosity and enthusiasm for the past. Well done, 6SH, for your excellent participation and thoughtful questions throughout the day!

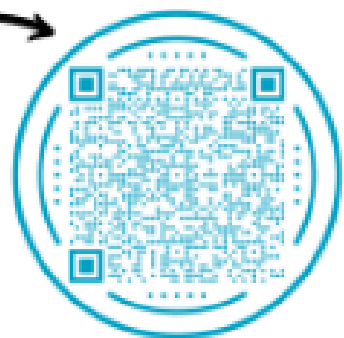


Blackpool Carers have a special Young Carers Team that can help and support you.
