Reception

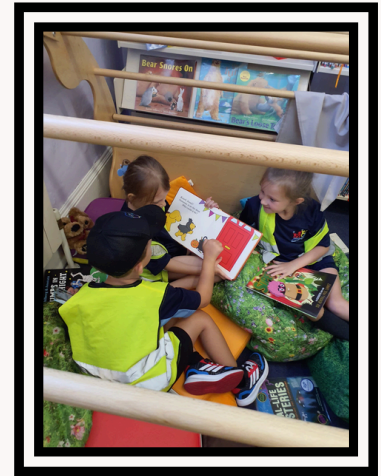

Year 1

In Design & Technology, we transformed into bakers and got hands-on with mixing and measuring, as well as developing our knife skills through grating and chopping, while creating our very own vegetable muffins. The children worked brilliantly together, showing great teamwork and enthusiasm throughout the process.

Of course, the best part was tasting them! Reviews were mixed—one child described their muffin as tasting "like cereal"... we're still deciding whether that's a positive or not!

Year 4

In Art, Year 4 have been working hard to complete their final clay sculptures. As part of our topic, we explored clay techniques and took inspiration from food festivals to create our own delicious-looking models. The children have produced some fantastic pieces, including burgers, pizzas and ice creams.

To round off our History unit on the Vikings, the children took part in creating a Viking podcast. Taking on the role, they answered questions to showcase everything they had learned throughout the topic. It was a brilliant way to celebrate their knowledge and bring our Viking learning to a memorable close!

Year 5

Year 5 have been exploring how humans change over time as part of their science learning. This week, the children investigated how height and heart rate can vary as we grow older. To gather real data, pupils visited classrooms across the school to measure height and to record heart rates both before and after exercise.

They threw themselves into the role of young scientists with great enthusiasm — and even a few teachers were brave enough to reveal their age and join in the investigation! The children had a fantastic time and gained valuable hands-on experience in collecting and analysing scientific data.



Year 6

Year 6 enjoyed a fantastic trip to The Grand Theatre to watch *Return to the Forest*, a captivating production by Theatre-Rites, a company renowned for creating playful and meaningful performances for children and adults alike.

The show was created in collaboration with award-winning South African choreographer Gregory Maqoma and combined energetic dance with magical puppetry to tell a powerful story. The audience was taken on an exciting journey from a museum into the heart of a wild and enchanting forest filled with wonder, adventure and fascinating creatures.

The stunning puppets and high-energy movement brought the forest to life, keeping everyone engaged from beginning to end. As the story unfolded, pupils were encouraged to think about what is precious in our world and how we can care for it. Year 6 thoroughly enjoyed the performance and were inspired by its creativity, imagination and important message about protecting the natural world. It was a memorable experience that sparked plenty of discussion on the journey back to school.

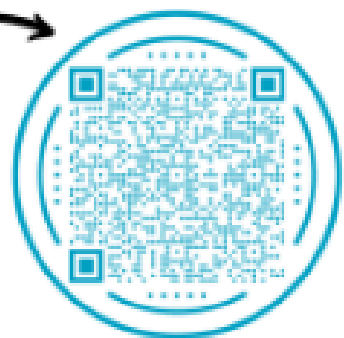
Blackpool Carers have a special Young Carers Team that can help and support you.
