Reception

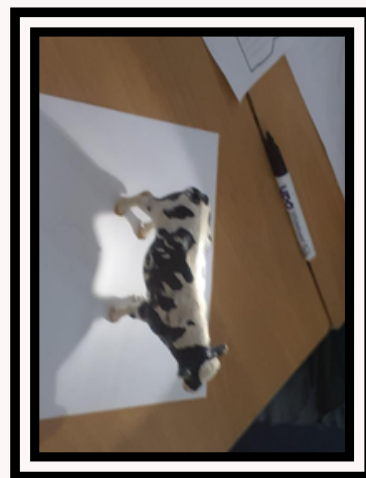
Year 1

This week, year 1 became shadow investigators! The children explored how shadows change when the position of a light source is moved.

Using toy animals, they drew around each shadow so they could compare how the shape and size changed as the light was moved. They loved seeing the different shadows they could create and were excited to test out their ideas!

We also talked about the Sun and how the time of day affects the length and shape of our shadows. Before each investigation, the children made predictions about which light position would create the longest and shortest shadows, then tested their ideas to see if they were right.

It was fantastic to see so much curiosity, teamwork, and scientific thinking. Well done year 1!



Year 2

This week in RE, we have been learning about places of worship in Judaism and exploring why these places are important to Jewish people.

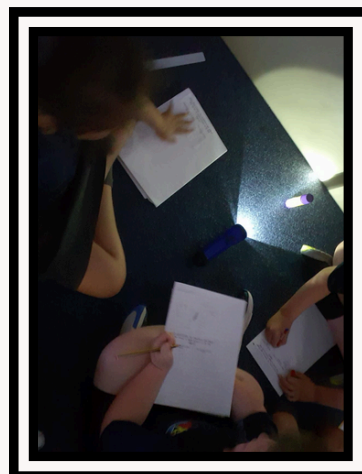
In Science, we continued observing our plants as they grow. The children recorded their observations carefully, just like scientists. In Art, we made our own stick dolls, wrapping wool around sticks to create colourful designs. The children showed great creativity and enjoyed bringing their creations to life.

Year 3

This week in Year 3, our young scientists have been investigating shadows. We learned that shadows are formed when an object blocks light from a light source. Through a series of exciting investigations, we explored how shadows can change size and shape depending on the position of the light. We made careful observations, asked scientific questions, and recorded our findings. We had great fun experimenting and were amazed by how much we discovered about light and shadows!

In maths, we have been learning to tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes on an analogue clock. We have practised reading clock faces and counting in fives to work out how many minutes have passed since the hour. Ask us at home and see if we can impress you with our time-telling skills!

Year 4

This week year 4 completed their water safety swimming session in the pyjamas. They now know all about how to stay safe near water and what to do if they fall in. We hope this will keep them safe over the summer break! Year 4 have accomplished so much in swimming this year. With most children now being able to swim totally independently. Year 6

This week, Year 6 has been fully immersed in learning about World War II, exploring what life was like during this significant period in history through a range of engaging activities.

The children have discovered the causes and key events of the war, while developing a deeper understanding of what daily life was like for families. They explored the challenges of rationing, learning why food and other everyday items were limited and how people adapted to make the most of what they had. The children were fascinated to compare wartime meals with those we enjoy today and gained a real appreciation of the resilience shown by communities during this time.

In Design and Technology, Year 6 put their creativity and problem-solving skills to the test by designing and constructing their own Anderson shelters. They carefully considered the strength and stability of their structures, using a variety of materials to create shelters that reflected the purpose and design of the originals.

It has been wonderful to see the enthusiasm, curiosity and teamwork shown by Year 6 throughout this week. They have asked thoughtful questions, developed valuable historical knowledge and made meaningful connections across a range of subjects. We are incredibly proud of all they have achieved.

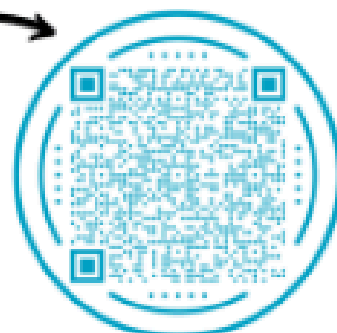

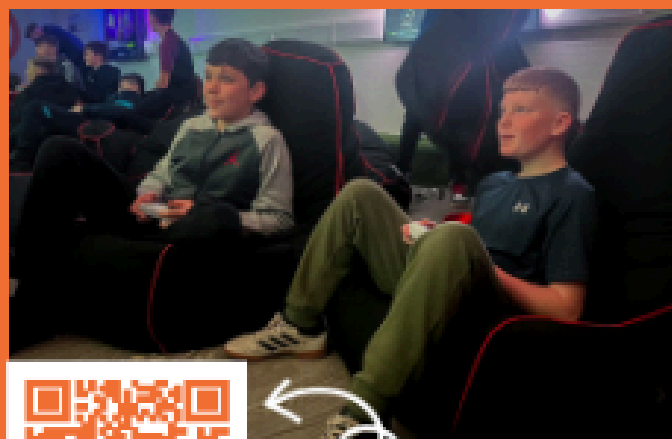
