Disability has also been a focus with a talk from our Community Governor Rick Clement. Disabled whilst serving in the British Army, Rick gave the children an insight in to daily living as a wheel chair bound person, who still enjoys life to the full like any other able bodied person!

Year 4

Using our 'ish' art skills, we created a painting that shows why we are unique. We started with the squiggle and transformed it into a picture which demonstrates our talents and interests.
