

Year 2-Summer 1

Maths: Multiplication, division and statistics

Learning to use the correct mathematical vocabulary.

Using concrete resources to practically solve mathematical problems and understanding different methods using division.

Children will learn how to use different graphs to analyse data.

Children will also learn read pictograms and tally charts to answer reasoning and problem solving questions.

R.E. How do we respond to things that matter?

We will be learning about the importance of the Easter Story to Christians. Then we will move on to celebrate the importance of the Islamic religion and culture.

English:

We are continuing to work hard on learning to blend, read and spell through our Read Write Inc scheme.

Writing sentences using the correct punctuation including, capital letters, full stops, question marks, commas and exclamation marks.

Children will write an alternative ending to a traditional tale.

We will continue to practice year one and two spellings.

Geography: The United Kingdom

Will be learning the countries that make up Great Britain, The United Kingdom and The British Isles and begin to understand the difference.

The children will also begin to understand the location of the United Kingdom and the surrounding seas and oceans.

We will also be learning about what a monarchy and a democratic government is.

ICT

Children will use a range of tools in a paint program to create digital art in the style of famous artists.

They will develop an understanding of the importance of computers and the internet to communicate and will learn how to carry out effective searches on the web.

PSHE: Rules, Rights and Responsibilities.

Children will have a better understanding on being able to take turns, share and also understand the need to return things that have been borrowed.

Children will also learn that they belong to various groups and communities such as family and school.

Science:

Living things and their habitats

Children will learn the scientific vocabulary used to classify animals.

We will also be identifying different habitats and investigating why a specific animal is suited to that habitat.

The children will also look at food chains so children will be able to describe how animals obtain their food.

Music

Children will be studying a genre of music and learning the glockenspiels.

History:

Queen Elizabeth II

The children will learn who Queen Elizabeth is and the important dates in the Queen's life.

We will also be finding out about the activities the Queen takes part in, her beliefs and the many traditions she follows.
