




**Attendance** 



Our target for the academic year is <u>95.7%</u>. Look at the graph above to see how your child's class is performing. Our average attendance last week was **86.55%** which is a decrease on the previous week and below our whole school target of **95.7%**.

Unauthorised attendances were quite high last week. If your child is ill, you must contact the school office to report the absence. Please <u>do not use Seesaw</u> to report an absence from school.

## Scarlet Fever

We have had an increasing number of confirmed cases of scarlet fever across the school. Although scarlet fever is usually a mild illness, it should be treated with antibiotics to minimise the risk of complications and reduce the spread to others.

The symptoms of scarlet fever include a sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. This is followed by a fine red rash, which typically first appears on the chest and stomach, rapidly spreading to other parts of the body. On more darkly pigmented skin, the scarlet rash may be harder to spot, but it should feel like 'sandpaper'. The face can be flushed red but pale around the mouth.

If you think you, or your child, have scarlet fever:

- See your GP or contact NHS 111 as soon as possible
- Make sure that you/your child takes the full course of any antibiotics prescribed by the doctor.
- Stay at home, away from nursery, school or work for at least 24 hours after starting the antibiotic treatment, to avoid spreading the infection.
- Report the illness to the school

If your child is unwell, please <u>do not send them into school</u>. If you are concerned about your child's attendance, please contact the school office.
