Last Inspection

The school was last inspected by ESTYN in 2014. ESTYN suspended inspections during the COVID-19 pandemic. The inspection framework has recently been updated and the school team are ensuring continued high standards.

Targets

Due to the change in Curriculum for Wales, it is no longer a requirement to track outcomes and levels. However, the school is trialling bespoke programmes to track individuals progress across the Areas of Learning and Experience.

The headteacher offers weekly attendance updates to parents within the school newsletter and has introduced the new school welfare officer. The school and welfare officer will continue to work with parents to improve whole school attendance.

- To continue to design and implement the Curriculum for Wales framework and our school level curriculum.
- To identify, celebrate, challenge and develop MAT pupils across the school and across a wide range of disciplines and talents.
- To improve standards of phonics awareness and spelling across the school.

Review of School Polices

All policies were reviewed by representatives of the Governing Body in September 2022 and accepted going forward.

Implementation and Review of School Strategies

Two workshops were held by Mr Smith about the implementation of the new sexual and relationships education. It is planned that the WRAP project will attend next year to attend a workshop. Mr Smith has prepared a video parents based on governor's feedback on how children progress in the new curriculum and how we communicate that to parents.

Leadership & Management

Rhiw Syr Dafydd is a Professional Learning Lead for the EAS. Rhiw Syr Dafydd has also been instrumental in collaborative work with the new curriculum and, also led the Ebbw Fawr cluster in devising their curriculum. Mr George is an Executive Board Member at University of South Wales where he is fundamental in shaping the future of future teachers.
