

As we approach the end of our final week of the Autumn term, I am delighted to reflect on the achievements and experiences of our school community. The commitment and resilience of our children have been truly exemplary, shining through in everything from their academic focus to their charitable spirit.

This half term has been defined by a strong sense of compassion and reflection. We began by exploring 'The Power of Good' during Anti-Bullying Week 2025, reinforcing our dedication to an inclusive environment. This maturity continued during our Remembrance Service, where the children demonstrated profound reverence. Beautifully balancing this solemnity was the joy of Children in Need Day, where we collectively raised £122.40. This spirit of giving was further echoed at our Christmas and Christingle service, which not only reinforced our spiritual values but raised a wonderful £152 for Save the Children.

Our connection to the wider community has been equally strong. Our choir has been spreading festive cheer at the Lichfield Cathedral Christmas Festival and Kings Bromley Nursing Home, emphasising the importance of intergenerational connection. Alongside this, our Worship and School Council shared insights from their visit to Uttoxeter Renew Church with the whole school, by exploring the Christmas story from the unique perspective of the Star of Bethlehem!

Inside the classroom, assessment week highlighted the extraordinary dedication of our children. I could not be more proud of the focus and determination they displayed. Learning also came to life outside the classroom; our Year 5 and 6 children gained profound insights into wartime Britain during their immersive World War 2 creative day and a visit to the Arboretum. They also wowed with their remarkable teamwork in a recent district indoor athletics competition.

Creativity was center stage during the Early Years and Key Stage 1 production. Their performance of 'Camalama-ding-dong' was a true testament to their confidence and provided a delightful twist on the traditional nativity.

I must also extend a huge thank you to the PTA. The Christmas Market was a tremendous success, it was a joyous event for all, raising vital funds that directly support our school's resources.

As we enter the final days of the term, preparations are in full flow for our community Christmas card delivery and whole school Christmas lunch and party day. We look forward to ending the term with joy, laughter and collective celebration.

### Values and 'The Big Question'


This half term's value has been 'service", the children have looked at how we can show this and what it looks like to others and in the bible.

#### CEO LETTER Autumn 2 2025



Welcome to my final update of the calendar year for autumn 2!



It feels like such a long time ago now - our Staff enjoyed their INSET day early November spending the morning with their respective schools looking at school priorities and they spent the afternoon learning more about safe and exciting use of Al for teaching and learning and administration.

We thank all our schools for hosting our Chair of Members, Mr David Grewer and our two new

Directors, Sophie Skelton and Jules Smith, across a whole day this half term. They had such a great time, were so complimentary about what they saw and experienced including school lunch! It put all of our discussions at Directors meetings into context.

Members of our Trust and Directors met for our annual AGM to look at the successes of the year, the challenges and our strategic plan going forward. We are grateful to these volunteers with amazing skill sets in their time and expertise to support our continual drive to improve.

We're pleased to confirm that we have received positive feedback from the 24/25 financial audit with an unqualified audit opinion. There were a small number of internal control issues which have been rectified immediately. We are grateful to the team at Daines and our central team for their hard work.

Our whole Trust continues to provide an excellent education for our children whilst trying to make savings in ways which impact the least on our children. We have taken on sourcing contractors for compliance checks which has taken away the service level agreement fee. This has been a significant amount of work and we are sure that this process will run smoothly going forward, it provides just one example of cost savings identified.

Children in Oak class at St Andrew's Primary led a wonderful worship on the theme of 'service'. We were so grateful to them for their methodical, clear and confident delivery, offering time for questions and answers and reflection. Some super poems and scripture, thank you and well done.



Our choir sang at Lichfield Cathedral, it was a truly beautiful evening - the children sang 'The Carol of the Bells', such a challenging carol and the children sang it absolutely wonderfully.









Several Richard Crosse children won a poetry competition and were invited to Stafford Grammar school, with Pep the Poet, to read their poetry and receive an award. What a fabulous evening.

The nativities, lunches, fairs and services I have been able to attend have been wonderful and, after this letter has been sent to our offices, I have the pleasure of Anson's, St Andrew's and Mary Howard's nativities and lunch at St Marys and Richard Crosse too! How wonderful.
