### Attendance update

Our attendance this year is looking great so far, thank you to everyone who is ensuring that their child/ren are in school on time and ready to learn. Attendance is measured within a school on a whole and individual basis by the DFE, local authority and also forms a large part of the schools accountability with OFSTED. The school and school staff have to follow national guidelines, procedures and criteria in terms of informing parents at certain absence percentage markers, attendance meetings, penalty notices etc.

I would just like to highlight a section from our policy, taken from national guidelines.

### An unauthorised absence is where:-

- The school considers that the the child was well enough to attend school but did not (for example the reason for illness absence is not listed by UK Health Security Agency guidance.)
- Medical evidence is not provided for an illness absence from school for 6 days or more.
- Medical evidence is not provided for a child who has already been absent from school for 6 days or more.
- Medical evidence is not provided for illness absence immediately before or after a period of school holiday.
- Medical evidence is not provided where there is a regular pattern to illness absence.
- The school considers that the absence was not unavoidable or exceptional.
- A leave of absence request is declined but still taken (this includes holidays in term time).
- Reasons for absence have been falsified.




