

wishes. We are immensely proud of all of the children


who took part in the competition but were blown away to discover that we had four national winners at our school!

A note from our Chair of Governors - Darren Walsh

The Local Governing Committee (LGC) was established recently as part of the governance arrangements for the school. The key functions are:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- Holding the headteacher to account for educational performance
- Ensuring proper and effective use of the school's financial resources

To achieve this the LGC meet once each term. The LGC is comprised of parent, foundation and lay governors, who possess a range of skills and experience in both the public and private sector. This experience is used to discharge the key functions of the LGC.

So, what does this look like in practice? You will no doubt be aware of and are experiencing the challenges of rising food and energy prices. These issues also impact upon the school and its budget. As an LGC, we look at how the school is coping with these challenges and work with the Headteacher and the Trust to ensure that the budget forecast has considered these challenges and that a balanced budget is achieved. This is really challenging at present as the costs linked to food and energy have not decreased. The School and Trust have some reserves, which mitigate some of this impact, however, the reserves can only be used once. It is also these reserves and efficiencies that would be required to fund other expenditure that is not covered in the education grant - such as pay rises and maintenance work of the School's buildings.

The role of the LGC is both challenging and rewarding, if you are interested in becoming a member of the LGC then please contact the school office for further information.

School Council



Attendance

At the end of Spring term our whole school attendance figure was 96.32% this is better than the national level of 94.6%. We really appreciate all of the support you give us in getting your children to school on time.



With us being such a small school, it does not take many pupils to have the odd couple of days' absence for the percentage to quickly go up.

Government departments track school attendance figures. It is considered that attendance of 90% or below is persistent absence which will be closely monitored by school staff. Failing to improve on this 90% can lead to prosecution, which school want to help families avoid.

Pupil Admission Numbers (PAN)

We are delighted that we have reached PAN this year with our new reception intake for 2024!

Schools are funded based on numbers of pupils (the school budget is based on an amount per pupil), thus operating a school below capacity is extremely difficult and cannot be maintained for long. As a school you still have to operate a certain number of classes and many costs are fixed such as utility bills, service charges etc, regardless of how many pupils attend. Unlike many small schools continually struggling to balance the budget, simply because they cannot attract sufficient numbers of pupils, we are very fortunate that we have reached PAN. Staffordshire Local Authority have said we can accommodate a further two children in our reception class, should they apply. This puts us in an enviable position should any pupils leave from any year group within the academic year. We must remain full for us to have any chance of maintaining current staffing, something I am sure you would all want us to strive for. Please be assured that class sizes, alongside the requisite staffing ratios, will remain within Government guidelines.

Parent Survey Overview

Thank you to everyone who completed the Parent Survey. The feedback is invaluable in helping us to evaluate and move forwards together!

Here's a quick overview:

Highlights:

- ✓ Happiness, safety and behaviour all score strongly agreed/agreed at 96% (28/29) 100%
- ✓ Quality of teaching, personal progress and personal development all score strongly agreed/agreed at 96% (28/29) - 100%
- ✓ School leadership and management, 89% strongly agreed/agreed that the school was led and managed well with 1 response for don't know and 1 for disagree.
- ✓ 93% of parents Strongly Agreed/Agreed that their child makes good progress at this school.
- ✓ 96% strongly agree/agree that they would recommend our school to another parent.
