Uniform reminder for September

On PE days you will continue to come in your school **PE kit** but again this is to be smart and comprise of:


- Plain unbranded black shorts
- Plain unbranded black tracksuit bottoms
- <u>Plain unbranded white</u> t-shirt or polo shirt
- <u>Plain unbranded black</u> jumper
- Plain black trainers



FAQ - Why plain and unbranded?

This is to ensure that all children see each other as equal and uniform does not become a 'brand competition.' Children who arrive in branded kit will be allocated clean unbranded substitutes that can be worn for the day.

Why plain trainers? - We wear our PE kits all day, twice a week, therefore the expectations on PE kits are the same as school uniforms. Plain black trainers look smart. They help to promote a sense of unity and equality among the children. It minimises pressure on families to purchase expensive or 'trendy' footwear, ensuring that all children feel comfortable and included regardless of their socio-economic background or personal style preferences. We understand that finding the right trainers can sometimes be a challenge, but we appreciate your cooperation in adhering to this. If you have any difficulties in sourcing appropriate footwear, please do not hesitate to contact the school office, and we will do our best to assist you.
