

### Intent: What do we want children to learn?

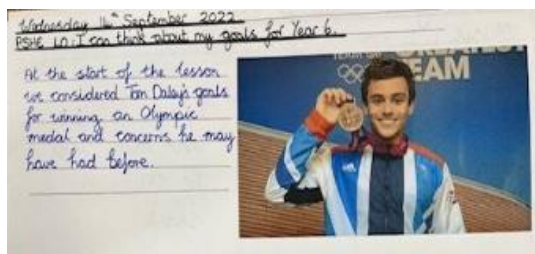
- We want to ensure that our children have a secure understanding of how to be healthy in mind, body and relationships.

## PSHE Intent, Implementation and Impact Statement



### Implementation: How do we do it at Rodbourne Cheney?

PSHE is taught through cross-curricular links, Values education, Children's Rights and the Jigsaw teaching resources.

We emphasise active learning by including the children in discussions, circle time, investigations and problem solving activities. We encourage children to take part in a range of tasks that promote active citizenship, for example charity fundraising, the planning of special school events (such as an assembly or open evening), involvement in helping other individuals or groups less fortunate than themselves.

We also develop PSHE and citizenship through activities and whole-school events, e.g. the school council representatives from each class meet regularly to discuss school matters.

### Impact: What are the outcomes and strengths?
