Dear Parents and Carers,

Firstly, I would like to take this opportunity to say a huge well done to the children for a fantastic first term. All children adopted new roles and responsibilities as they began their final year at the school. They are already brilliant ambassadors for the school and will continue to be for the rest of the year, we have no doubt. It's been a real pleasure watching them develop over the first term and we know that they are going to have a fantastic Term 2 as well.

In Term 1, the children completed a range of wonderful learning across all subjects. In English, we loved our class text 'The Emergency Zoo' and the children completed super diary entries from the perspective of a main character before completing a non-chronological report on the Blitz. World War Two was indeed our main topic for the term and we learnt about how the war started and ended and also what life would have been like between 1939 and 1945, by delving deeper into rationing and evacuation. The children's knowledge organisers at the end of the term were outstanding! In Art, the children developed their sketching skills and also completed stunning mixed media pieces for our Take One focus on Henri Rousseau at the start of the term. In Science, we focused on Electricity and lots of time in Maths was devoted to place value and the four operations. A range of super learning also took place across many other subjects. To see what learning we will be completing in Term 2, you should receive a Topic Web alongside this letter. Our two class texts will be 'The Snow Queen' and 'A Christmas Carol'. The latter is always a popular choice with Christmas fast approaching, and as well as reading Charles Dickens' classic version, we will also watch 'The Muppet Christmas Carol', a lesson the children always love!

Our Values this term are 'Equality' and 'Hope'. We will also continue to put the children's mental and physical wellbeing at the forefront of all we do by moving onto the second theme of our wellbeing curriculum based on 'The 5 Ways to Wellbeing'. Our wellbeing focus for Term 2 will be 'Giving'. As always, we will also continue to make sure our three school rules of 'Be Safe, Be Kind, Be Respectful' are upheld.



Thank you for your support with the children's home learning in Term 1. Home Learning, chosen from the children's Maths, Reading and EGPS CGP books, will continue to be set each Monday to be handed in and marked the following Monday. It will be based on prior learning and used as a way of consolidating what the children have already been taught. Alongside this, the children will also have weekly spellings and should practice their times tables at home. It remains our expectation that the children read regularly at home and record what they read in their Reading Records. Please see the end of the letter for some updated recommended reads for Year 6 children.

To help prepare for the high expectations at secondary school and to continue to be Year 6 role-models, it is very important that our children wear the correct uniform. Our school uniform is as follows:

- Blue jumper
- White or blue polo shirt (with all buttons fastened)
- Black or grey shorts
- Black or grey skirt
- Blue summer dress
- Children are able to wear all black footwear.

PE will be taught on Tuesdays and Thursdays so children will need to make sure that they wear their PE kits into school on this day each week. Children should wear PE uniform only. As with last term, we will also be encouraging all of our Year 6 pupils to be sports ambassadors to our whole school. This means that their PE kit will consist of a **black PE top** if possible (or white as normal) with black or blue bottoms. Children will also need to bring in a refillable water bottle each day.

Finally, another huge well done to the children for such a super start to the school year. I am extremely proud of how they have taken on board what it means to be a Year 6 pupil and am very much looking forward to another exciting term of learning.
