Dear Parents and Carers,

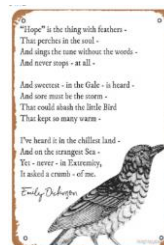
Welcome back to school, and welcome to Year 4! I am very excited to be back in school and am really looking forward to getting to know everyone. We are going to have a very enjoyable year!

Curriculum:

This term's question is 'Who has changed our world?' Year 4 will be focusing our history topic on The Vikings and what they did to influence life in the UK and other countries.

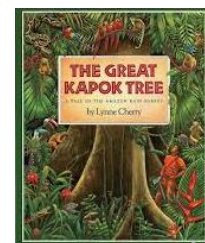
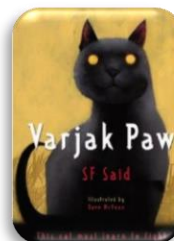
For the first few days back in school, we will be studying a poem called 'Hope' by Emily Dickinson. We will create our own version of a poem and art based on feathers.



The text that we will be studying as part of our history topic is 'Odd and the Frost Giants' by Neil Gaiman. This is a book about a Viking boy, and he will enable the children to learn about the life of this boy as a Viking and their beliefs.

The text extracts we will be studying to continue to develop our skills in fluency, understanding and exploring is 'Varjak Paw' by SF Said.

The text we will study to inspire our writing skills is 'The Great Kapok Tree' by Lynne Cherry.





Our Values this term are 'Respect' and 'Courage'. These support the promotion of our three school rules: 'Be Safe, Be Kind, Be Respectful'.

Lots of parents often ask me about ideas for books to read at home so there are some ideas of popular books for Year 4 at the end of this letter, in school, children choose books, from the library or a few recommended texts in the classroom. Children will be able to take books home. It is important that children always have their books with them in school so that they can continue reading in school too, especially as there will be opportunities to read with an adult.

Homework will be set each Friday and will need to be handed in the following Thursday.

Reading	It is our expectation that the children read regularly at home (4 times a week, 2 of these should be reading to an adult or older sibling); this should be recorded in the child's Reading Record, which should be present in school every day too.
Mathematics	Times Tables completed 5 times a week
Spellings	Completed 5 times a week ready for a test on Friday

PE will be taught on **Tuesdays and Thursdays**. Children should continue to come into school in their PE kits on these days:

Black / blue tracksuit bottoms, leggings or shorts
White PE t-shirt
Blue or black tracksuit top or school jumper
Trainers or daps

School Uniform:

Blue jumper
White or blue polo shirt
Black or grey shorts / trousers
Black or grey skirt
Blue summer dress / Black or grey skirt/pinafore
Children must wear footwear that is **all black**

It is important that our children come to school in the correct school uniform as it gives a sense of pride and belonging to the Rodbourne Cheney Community/family.

Children will also need to bring in a refillable water bottle each day to ensure that they have safe access to water. Our classroom has a drinking water tap for the children to use when needed.

Finally, one last reminder that doors will open at **8:30am** with register at **8.35am** and lessons starting at **8.45am**. Children will enter through the class door near the Broadway entrance to the school. We would encourage children to walk to the classroom door independently where possible. The day finishes at **3:25pm (1:30pm on Fridays)**.

All that's left to say is that I am looking forward to welcoming back the children and am very excited about the year ahead.
