Addis Ababa is the capital city of Ethiopia with a population of 4.8 million people.



Kinshasa is the capital city of The Democratic Republic of Congo. with a population of over 16 million people.



Nairobi is the capital city of Kenya with a population of over 4 million people.

The Maasai tribe live in Kenya and Tanzania. They live in the African Savannahs and use the land as their home where they all live together. Men are traditionally in charge of the tribe



while women take care of the children. The men perform a special jumping dance.

Human and Physical geography features in Africa			
River Nile (physical)	The longest river in Africa. It flows through Sudan and Egypt and into the Mediterranean Sea. It is 6,650 kilometres long.		
The Pyramids of Giza (human)	These pyramids are located in Egypt and they were built around 2550 BC.		
Victoria Falls (physical)	Victoria falls is a waterfall on the Zambezi river. It is located on the border of Zambia and Zimbabwe.		
Great Mosque of Djenné (human)	The great mosque of Djenné, which is located in Mali, is made of mud bricks coated with clay. It was built in the early 1900s
