Dear Parents and Carers,


First and foremost, I'd like to wish you all a warm welcome back to school for Term 4. I hope you and your family had a nice break! As always, we have an action-packed term coming up but I would also like to take the chance to celebrate our learning from last term too.

Throughout last term, the children completed some excellent learning. In English, we loved our class text 'The Girl of Ink & Stars'. We took inspiration from it by creating our very own mythical islands, heroes and villains culminating in the writing of a myth. Later in the term, we wrote non-chronological reports on a mythical hybrid creature, using AI to bring them to life! It was wonderful to see the children take such pride and enjoyment from their work. In History, we thoroughly enjoyed our Ancient Greek topic. We started the term by immersing ourselves into Ancient Greek culture before dedicating future lessons to democracy, Athens and Sparta, Ancient Greek life, the Olympics and much more! Cross-curricular links were made to our Art topic which culminated in the children producing clay Greek pots. The children loved making them and were experts at carving intricate patterns.

In Science, we focused on 'Living Things and their Habitats' whilst in PE, we enjoyed creating Olympic Dance routines. We enjoyed creating Scratch projects in Computing and dedicated lots of time to area, perimeter and volume in Maths. To see what learning we will be completing in Term 4, you should receive a Topic Web alongside this letter. Term 4 is our author study and we will be looking at the works of Shaun Tan. Our main class text will be 'The Viewer' although we will be reading other Shaun Tan books including 'The Lost Thing'. Our geography focus will be 'Trade and Economics'. You should also receive a Geography Knowledge Organiser complete with key facts and key vocabulary; all of which related to what we will be focusing on in Geography this term.

Our Values this term are 'Appreciation' and 'Love'. We will also continue to put the children's mental and physical wellbeing at the forefront of all we do by moving onto the fourth theme of our wellbeing curriculum based on 'The 5 Ways to Wellbeing'. Our wellbeing focus for Term



4 will be 'Take Notice' as we will encourage the children to pay more attention to the present moment, to their own thoughts and feelings and to the world around them. As always, we will also continue to make sure our three school rules of 'Be Safe, Be Kind, Be Respectful' are upheld.

Thank you for your continued support with your child's Home Learning. Home learning will be chosen from the children's CGP books, and will continue to be set each Monday. Alongside this, the children will also have weekly spellings. Your child should also practice their times tables at home ahead of Rapid Recall lessons in school. It remains our expectation that the children read regularly at home and record what they read in their Reading Records; thank you again for your support with this. PE will be taught on Tuesdays and Thursdays so children will need to make sure that they wear their PE kits into school on this day each week. Children should wear PE uniform only. As with last term, we will also be encouraging all of our Year 6 pupils to be sports ambassadors to our whole school. This means that their PE kit will consist of a **black PE top** if possible (or white as normal) with black or blue bottoms. Children will also need to bring in a refillable water bottle each day.

Key Stage 2 SATs/ Residential Meeting

SATs are now fast approaching and the children should be proud of their efforts in Year 6. They are continuing to work very hard and have made excellent progress this year. On Tuesday March 18th, we will hold a Parents' Meeting in the school hall from 3:30 - 4:00.
