The results were counted from sports day and our mini Euros. It was a very close competition this year. Congratulations to England team for being our overall winners!



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
National Thank a Teacher Day


Please include a name, age and contact detail on the art. This won't be shared, but will allow the Trust to contact the children whose art work is chosen to be displayed at the hospital.
