 Questions you might ask: What puzzles you? Is it real? What is right? What is wrong? What is 'good'? What do we mean by true? How do we know what things are? Are names important? Do friends matter? 	 Questions you might ask: How do people celebrate? What might people use this artefact for? What ceremonies and festivals have you taken part in? What happens in (place of worship/special place of interest)? What do these symbols mean? What is most important to you?
 Pupils should be able to: Raise puzzling and interesting questions about religious and non-religious stories. Raise puzzling and interesting questions about the world around them. Talk about what concerns them about different ways in which people behave. Say what matters to them or is of value. Use their senses to investigate religion and belief.
