Inspecting primary school PE and school sport: new funding

Background

The Primary PE and Sport Premium was launched by the Government in April 2013 and is available for 3 academic years: 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2015/16. It is ring-fenced funding to be used by the school to improve the quality and breadth of our PE and sport provision.

Anticipated Allocation: £9345

School has allocated the funding to the following priorities following analysis of school requirements:

calendar of competitions and festivals.

Attendance at these clubs is now being monitored in a systematic way to track attendance and involvement with a particular emphasis in tracking attendance of pupil premium children.</p>
<p>Funding towards activities booked for Sports Week /Healthy Schools Week</p>	<p>all</p>	<p>This week of activities aims to raise pupils' awareness of sports and physical activity not usually provided through school curriculum through a week dedicated to sport and healthy lifestyles.</p>
<p>Transport to competitions</p>	<p>KS2</p>	<p>Transport to competitions allows children to participate in competitive situations both as individuals and in teams, set themselves goals and challenges and boost their self-esteem. Competitions can open up new opportunities for children to participate in sport or physical activity in the wider community. As a development point, a system needs to be created where children selected to attend competitions is monitored with the aim of increasing the number of children attending competitions.</p>
