PE lessons and clubs update

Our contract with Tom Burke Academy has come to an end. However, this doesn't mean that children will no longer access PE lessons. Children will have high quality PE lessons on their usual day with teachers from Vision Education until an agreement for PE lessons and after school clubs with a new provider is finalised. I envisage our new agreement to start on 25th February 2019 and will update you as soon as I have more information. Please note that all Tom Burke Academy after school clubs have now been cancelled and refunds will be issued to parents who have paid for clubs in advance.

Heating Update

As you know, we have two major leaks under the floor in the lower school which has caused our heating system to shut down. I understand the huge impact school closure has upon parents and so made the decision to buy heaters for classrooms to keep the school operational. These have, however, not produced sufficient warmth and so, following a visit from our CEO yesterday, a new temporary heating solution is being sought. I am pleased to inform you that work to rectify the problem has begun, although this will be extensive as the faulty pipework runs beneath the main hall floor. I would like to offer my sincere thanks to you for being so supportive and understanding during this difficult time and request that children continue to wear layered clothing.


