As you'll have seen in the media, school leaders across the country are busy planning for the possible reopening of schools to specific year groups at the start of June, subject to the Government's five tests being met.

I mentioned in last week's newsletter that I have written a detailed plan for when we reopen our doors to EYFS, Y1 and Y6 children. This plan will be reviewed by the Trustees of the Enquire Learning Trust next Tuesday and, subject the plan being agreed, I will be able to share more details with you. I understand that some parents have not yet made a decision regarding sending their child back to school, as they feel they do not have enough information upon which to base their decision. There is no pressure to make up your mind at this moment in time. The texts that have been sent out asking whether children will be returning are for gathering initial information only and are not to pressure you into making an immediate decision. Please be aware that, should you decide to send your child to school, the times allocated for arrival and departure MUST be adhered to (children in class 'families' will arrive and depart in allocated time slots starting from 8.40am - 9.15am and 2.40pm - 3.15pm). School will operate as normally as possible and so, if you decide to send your child to school, there will be an expectation that they attend every day. You can, however, choose to remove your child should your family situation or the situation re COVID-19 change locally or nationally. There will be lots of safety measures in place in school, over which I have control. One of the safety measures, however, will depend upon parents. Upon return, there will be an expectation that children's clothes are washed at the end of each day - they will leave their school jumpers/cardigans at school so that these do not need to be washed each day. We do have spare, clean, school jumpers in school that may be borrowed, so please do not worry if your child has outgrown their school jumper - you will not need to buy a new one. There will be no expectation that children wear full uniform - I know that very few children own five sets of uniform! Also, if children have grown out of their school shoes, there will be no requirement for you to purchase new shoes for them - uniform requirements will be relaxed at this difficult time. I know that washing clothes at the end of each day is a big ask, but it is a measure that needs to be in place to keep everyone safe. As I stated earlier, I know that information has been limited so far, but please be assured that I shall share more details with you once our reopening plan and risk assessment have been approved.

I would like to take the opportunity to offer heartfelt thanks to those parents who have expressed their gratitude and support at this difficult time. Your positive messages have really helped to keep spirits up amongst staff who are working incredibly hard behind the scenes to offer great learning opportunities for children, support for vulnerable children and families and provide excellent provision for Key Workers' children. I am incredibly proud of our Roseberry family.
