Welcome back to what I know will be another busy term! For some children, it will be a time to return to school but, for others, learning will continue to take place at home with online learning opportunities provided for **all children of all year groups** via Teams.

We are really looking forward to seeing the children who plan to return to school on Monday.

Our reopening plan is robust, with measures in place to make school as safe as possible. Staff have planned to ensure that as well as reconnecting children with their learning, children's emotional and transition needs will be met as they return to school. We understand that children are living through very strange times, indeed, and there will be lots of time given to rebuilding confidence and being able to talk about worries and wishes.

Roseberry staff have ensured that they have followed Government regulations regarding social distancing, both in school and at home, in order to keep themselves and others safe. Although our reopening plan will ensure that school is as safe as possible, we need parents to ensure that they, too, play their part in order to make it work. Here are the *basics* regarding what we request you do, but please see my blog, which goes into more detail and may answer any questions you may have. Please also inform childminders of this information if you are not bringing your child into school:

Children do not need to wear full school uniform, as clothes should be washed daily, but will need their school jumper / cardigan which will be left at school.

Children only need to bring the following from home: lunch (if not having a school lunch), water bottle (labelled with their name), a healthy snack for break time, a coat and a sunhat. If the weather is sunny, please ensure that your child wears sunscreen to school. If your child has an inhaler or epipen, please ensure that these are sent in, too, labelled with your child's name and given to their teacher / staff member. Your child will not be allowed to bring bags and toys into school, sorry!

If your child is not eligible for Universal or Free School meals, you may order a school packed lunch via the office, payable via ParentPay. Children are also free to bring in a packed lunch from home.

Please ensure that you arrive at the school gate at the time specified for your child's class family group (see the reopening plan on my blog 27th May for details).

Please practise social distancing on the way to and from school. There are 2m interval markings on the pavement to help you to social distance when waiting outside school. Please see my blog re details of the one way system suggested when bringing / collecting children from school.

Please note: adults other than staff and approved visitors will not have access to the school site and so children will be collected and returned at the gate by staff at class family group allotted times. Children with siblings in EYFS and Y1, may arrive with their siblings and go straight into school to wait on the grey sofas in the main entrance in the lower school until their class arrival time.

Key Worker Childcare will be based in the upper school - please see my blog for details regarding access arrangements. If you are a Key Worker and wish to use our provision, please contact the school office. Children must be registered for provision before admission.
