September Breakfast Club news!

I am pleased to inform you that our Breakfast Club will start again when we return to school in September. The cost for Breakfast Club has been increased to £4 per session per child, payable via ParentPay. Breakfast Club opens at 7.30am and children are provided with breakfast, adult supervision and access to games, books and iPads. You don't need to book in advance, just bring your child to the upper school main entrance and ring the bell for access. Children in EYFS and Key Stage One (infants) will be taken to their classrooms by an adult at the start of the school day. We will try wherever possible to ensure that children stay in their 'bubbles' whilst in Breakfast Club.

Classes for September

Class lists for September will be released on Teams today. Classes are set by school leaders in consultation with current teachers who know children extremely well. They know which children work well together, which children distract one another, and the way in which individuals learn. We consider boy:girl ratio and the percentage of children who may need additional support or challenge. We also consider the balance of Roseberry:Marwood children in Year Three/Four classes. The balance within each class is carefully considered. Children may not always be with their best friend, but please reassure them that this is not a bad thing - they wouldn't be able to sit and natter to their friends in class anyway! They will learn to collaborate with others and make new friends, saving the social side of school for playtime!
