Tweak of the week!

I am delighted that our staggered arrival and departure times have worked well, enabling people to social distance. I am aware, however, aware that some parents with small children have to wait for up to 30 minutes to collect their older children at the end of the day. Now that we are in the swing of things, I propose that we change the time for EYFS, Y1 and Y2 pick up to 3pm from Monday 21st September. All other timings will remain the same.

What happens if a member of the Roseberry family develops coronavirus symptoms whilst in school?

If anyone in school becomes unwell with a new and persistent cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia), they will be sent home and advised to follow 'Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection', which sets out that they should self-isolate for at least 10 days and should have a test to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19).

If they have tested positive whilst not experiencing symptoms but develop symptoms during the isolation period, they should restart the 10 day isolation period from the day they develop symptoms.

Other members of their household (including any siblings) should self-isolate for 14 days from when the symptomatic person first had symptoms.

I understand the frustration of not being able to acquire a test in a timely manner and am grateful that you will ensure (or have ensured) that your family isolates whilst waiting to access a test.

Microsoft Teams is now used by every class in school. Teachers share important information and homework via Teams and children will be asked to upload their work onto their class channel rather than bringing in paper based work and models from home. Teams will be used as our online home learning platform for children who need to isolate so that they don't fall behind with their learning. Photos of children's learning may also be shared via Teams, as well as on our class blogs on our website.

Even our Parents' evening appointments will be via Teams video link in October!

It is really important that you and your child know how to access this platform and that you check your class channel on a regular basis.
