Please ensure that you social distance from people who do not live in your household when travelling to and from school and waiting for your child. If adults are on school premises (even outdoors) there is still a requirement that they wear a face covering, unless exempt from doing so.

We understand that some children will be excited about coming to school but that others may feel a little wobbly. There is a powerpoint on every Teams class page for children to watch and Stan's magic hug video is on my blog for all to see. Staff are acutely aware of the need to ensure that children feel safe and happy returning to school and have planned to address children's emotional needs upon their return and beyond. They will also plan to ensure that children who have lost learning during lockdown are provided with opportunities to enable them to thrive and achieve.

If you borrowed a laptop or iPad from school to enable your child to access Teams at home during lockdown, please ensure that it is returned on 8th March and that all photos and videos have been deleted (including in the deleted items file).
