My Child At School App - Important information!

As you know, we currently use the My Child At School app to enable parents to order school lunches, book onto clubs and pay for lunches, clubs and school visits and enrichment activities.

Very soon, we will be using this app to send messages, rather than using the texting service Teachers2Parents. It is really important that you have downloaded and activated the app and that you allow notifications from the app so that, should you be sent a message, you receive it as soon as it is sent.

If you are still struggling to set up the app, please let us know and we will be able to help you. Please also ensure that you have completed the permissions section of the app, letting us know whether you agree to your child's photograph being shared on social media etc. This can be found on the menu on the left hand side of the My Child At School home screen.

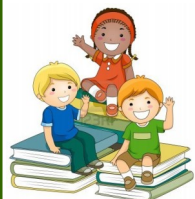
