Learning to look after our mental health

We know that the pandemic has had a negative impact upon the mental health of adults and children and are witnessing a growing number of children who are struggling with their emotions. We believe that looking after our mental health, and teaching children to do so, is so very important. With this in mind, we have commissioned a bespoke mindfulness programme to be written for Roseberry, which will involve training staff in delivering mindfulness sessions to children throughout each week. Children will learn to recognise when they are struggling and learn the skill of calming themselves and finding inner peace. Learning at Roseberry is so much more than reading, writing
