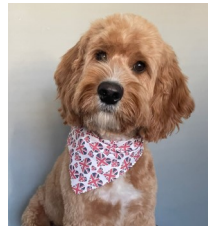
Stay safe in the sun!

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Do you know what your child is accessing online?

We have become increasingly concerned about the types of games that some of our youngest children are being exposed to at home. We have noticed that children are using the names of characters from online games within their play and also drawing detailed pictures of unpleasant and scary characters.

The characters children mention regularly are from Poppy's Playground and Roblox games, both of which are not deemed suitable or appropriate for young children. Roblox has an age rating of 12+ on some devices, and asks that children under the age of 18 have parental consent to play. Although Poppy's Playground does not have an age rating in the UK it is described as a Horror Adventure Game.

Please ensure that, should your child have access to any form of electronic device, you are aware of what they are playing, at all times. It's also worth making sure that they don't have access to the device without your knowledge (including when everyone in the house is asleep), and that they are not watching what their older siblings or family members are playing. Many online games sound innocent from their title but contain quite upsetting and disturbing content.

Technology is wonderful, but can also be harmful to our children if we don't take action to safeguard them.
