
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#### **Used Uniform shop**

Microsoft Teams: your child has an account and posts are shared on their class page. These posts may be celebrations of children's learning, or important information regarding visits, homework or resources needed.

My Child At School: emails and alerts are sent via this app, straight to your phone or device. Please ensure you have this app! Without it you can't access information, order meals or pay for visits and clubs.
